

Day 6

The road from Rovinj will take you to Fažana, the starting point for visiting the **National Park Brijuni**. This is a place with exceptional flora, where the former Yugoslavian President Marshal Josip Broz Tito had his personal State Summer Residence. The Brijuni Islands are a group of 14 little islands, offering several archaeological and cultural sites you can discover. You can visit the 13th-century St. Mary's Church, as well as two ancient Roman villa remains and the remains of a Byzantine palace. The last remain is Hill-fort, which indicates a Bronze Age settlement on the island dating back to 14th century BC. Fun fact: on Veliki Brijun Island, over 200 dinosaur footprints have been discovered.

On your way to **Opatija**, you will stop in Pula, the largest town in Istria that is well-known for its ancient Roman buildings, the most famous of which is the Pula Arena, one of the best preserved Roman amphitheaters, and its beautiful sea. The city has a long tradition of fishing, shipbuilding, wine making and tourism. You can take an evening walk by the sea from Opatija towards Rijeka if you like.

Parking Fažana, Perojska 23, 52212 Fažana, Croatia - *Parking Fažana* (paid) can be found close to the waterside, which is just a few hundred meters from where the boat leaves to Fazana. The ticket office is less than 100 meters from the pier.
